

Barbara Howard anchored WGBH's All Things Considered 2015-2019. She is an award-winning anchor, reporter, writer, and producer with extensive local, national, and international experience. Before being recruited by WGBH, Barbara had for many years worked for WBUR as an anchor, reporter, and editor. Her radio series "Liberation Remembered" won a Peabody Award, and her long-form work was included in "The Best of NPR." Barbara spent three years in Berlin filing for NPR, BBC World News, and Marketplace, and later reported from China for KQED and Voice of America while living for another three years in Beijing. Barbara was an associate producer and audio producer for the landmark 'Eyes on the Prize' television series, which aired on PBS. Born in Pennsylvania and raised on the east coast and in the Midwest, Barbara discovered her love of broadcasting at her tiny college radio station, WECI at Earlham College in Richmond, Indiana. She and her husband, Pulitzer Prize winning journalist and author Jonathan Kaufman, moved to Newton 26 years ago, where they raised their three children.
