

Dr. Giovanni G. Fazio is currently a Senior Physicist, Center for Astrophysics | Harvard & Smithsonian; Lecturer, Astronomy Department, Harvard University; and Faculty Emeritus, International Space University, Strasbourg, France. He received his Ph.D. in physics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), and has performed research in the area of space astronomy for more than 60 years. He has been the Principal Investigator for instruments on three space telescope missions and Co-Investigator on a fourth space mission. He was the Principal Investigator for the Infrared Array Camera on NASA's Spitzer Space Telescope, which observed the Universe for the last sixteen years. He has served on numerous NASA advisory committees and was the recipient of many national and international awards.
